Lake Bohinj



- Lake Bohinj is the largest lake in Slovenia.
- Lake Bohinj is 4.2 km long and 1 km at its maximum width.
- Lake Bohinj is located in the Bohinj municipality in the north-west of the country, and is inside Triglav National Park.





Lake Bled

- Lake Bled is a glacial lake in the Julian Alps in northwestern Slovenia, where it adjoins the town of Bled. The area is a popular tourist destination.
- The lake is 2,120 m long and 1,380 m wide, with a maximum depth of 30.6 metres.
- It has got an island where the church is on.





Triglav Lakes Valley

- The valley is also called the Seven Lakes Valley, although there are ten and not seven lakes in the valley.
- The lowest lying lake is the Black Lake at an altitude of 1,294 metres above sea level.
- there are two interconnected lakes known as The Double Lakes.
- The highest is the Lake at Podstenje, which is located at the altitude of 1,993 m.





Lake Cerknica

- Lake Cerknica is an intermittent lake near Cerknica.
- The lake, which under ordinary conditions has an area of about 26 km² and a mean depth of 6.1 metres.
- The changes in level are, however, very irregular. Sometimes the lake does not disappear for several years, and it can remain dry for over a year, as it did in 1834-35. It is rich in fish, which disappear and return with the water.



Wild Lake

- The lake is also a karst spring and water flows from under the ground and through a steeply inclined tunnel.
- The tunnel has been explored to a depth of 160 metres.



Križna Cave

- The cave is particularly noted for its chain of twenty-two subterranean of emerald green water.
- One of the lakes is known as the Port of Venice.
